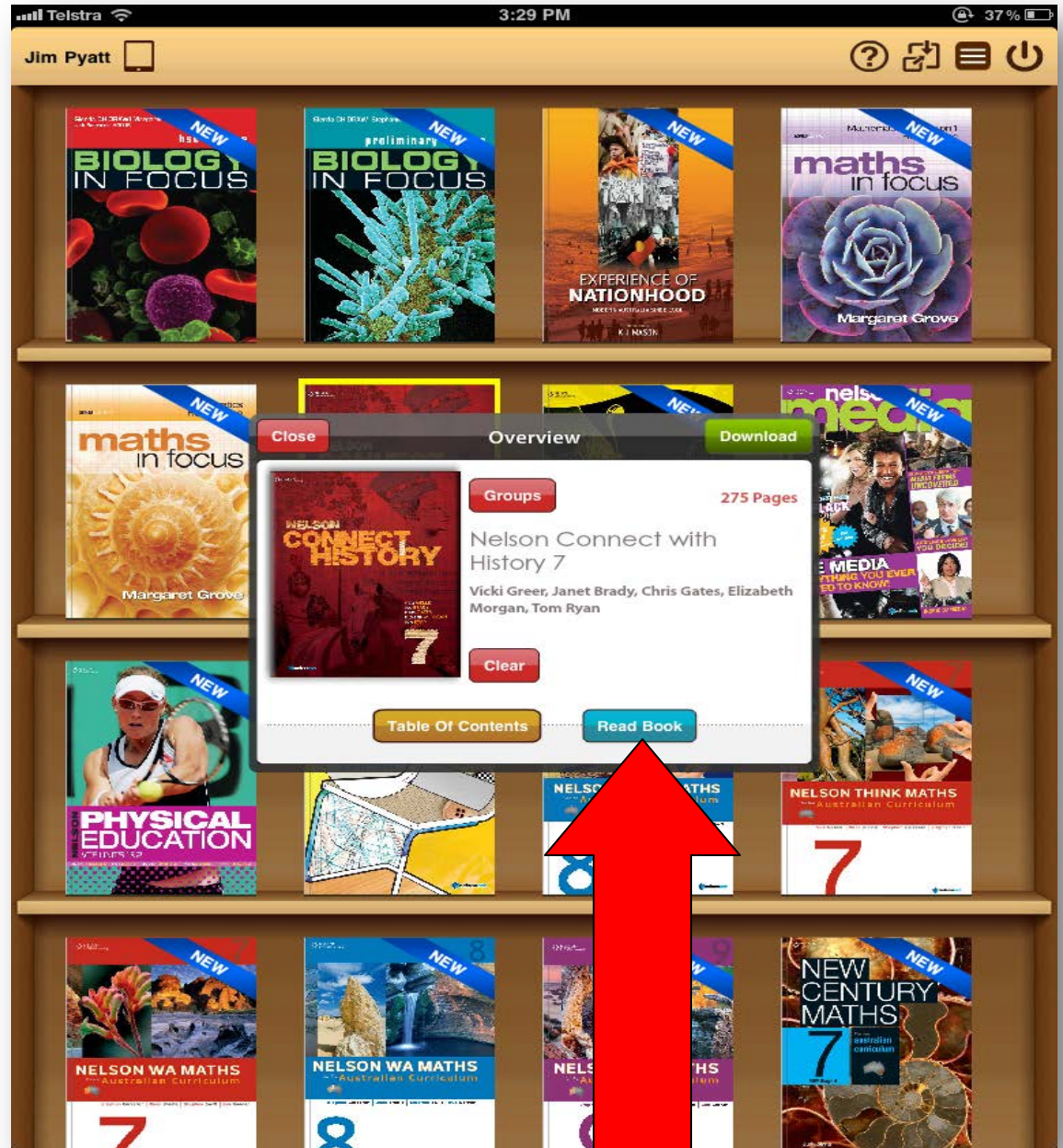
## The Bookshelf

After signing into the NelsonNetBook iPad app you will automatically be taken to your bookshelf. You will be able to see all of the eBooks that you have access to.



## Reading your eBook

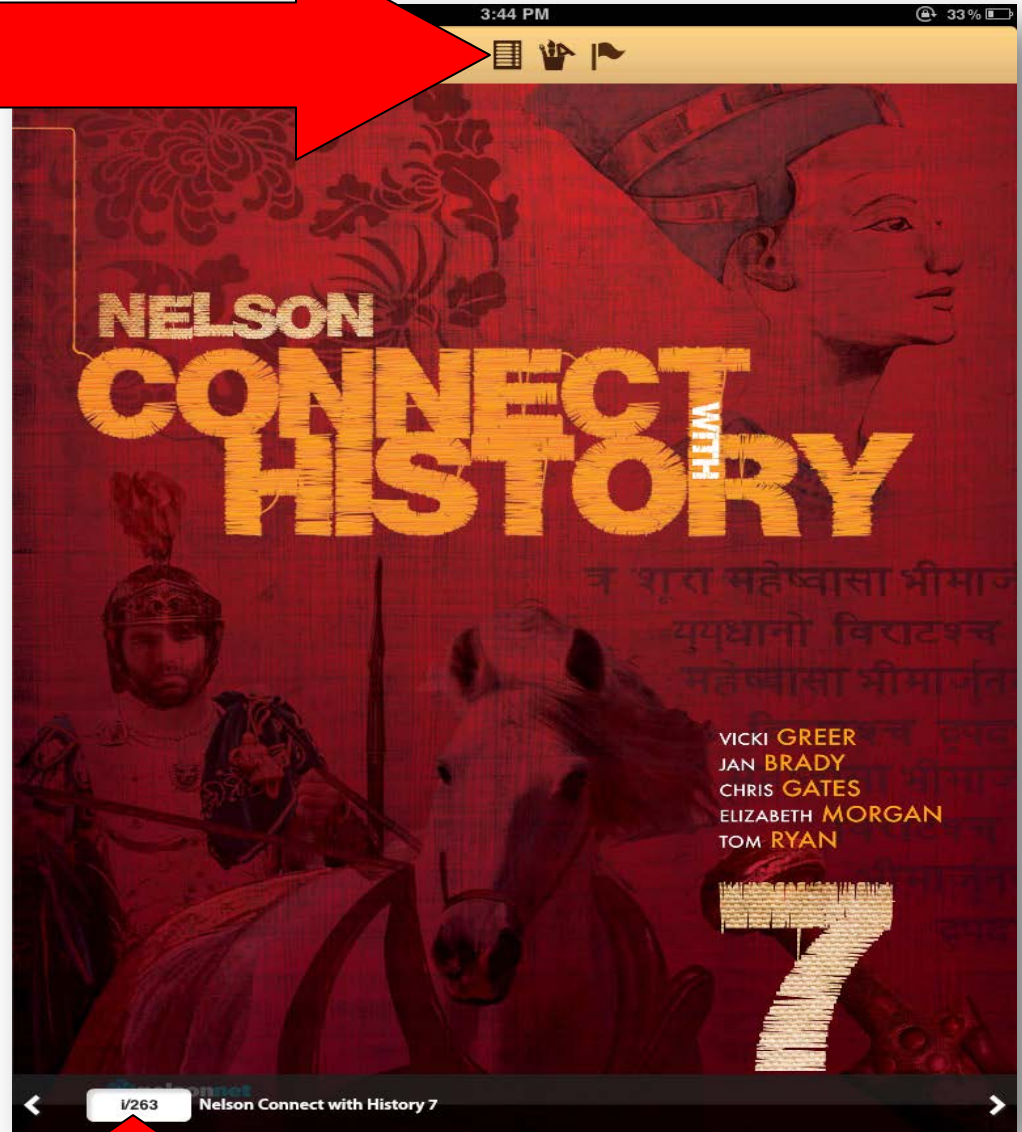
To access the eBook simply press the cover of the desired title from your bookshelf and select **“Read Book”**



## Navigating the eBook

To flip pages simply swipe the screen. Alternatively you can access the table of contents by selecting the “**Table of Contents**” icon at the top of the screen.

You can also enter the desired page number in the box at the bottom left of the screen or simply select the arrows on each side.

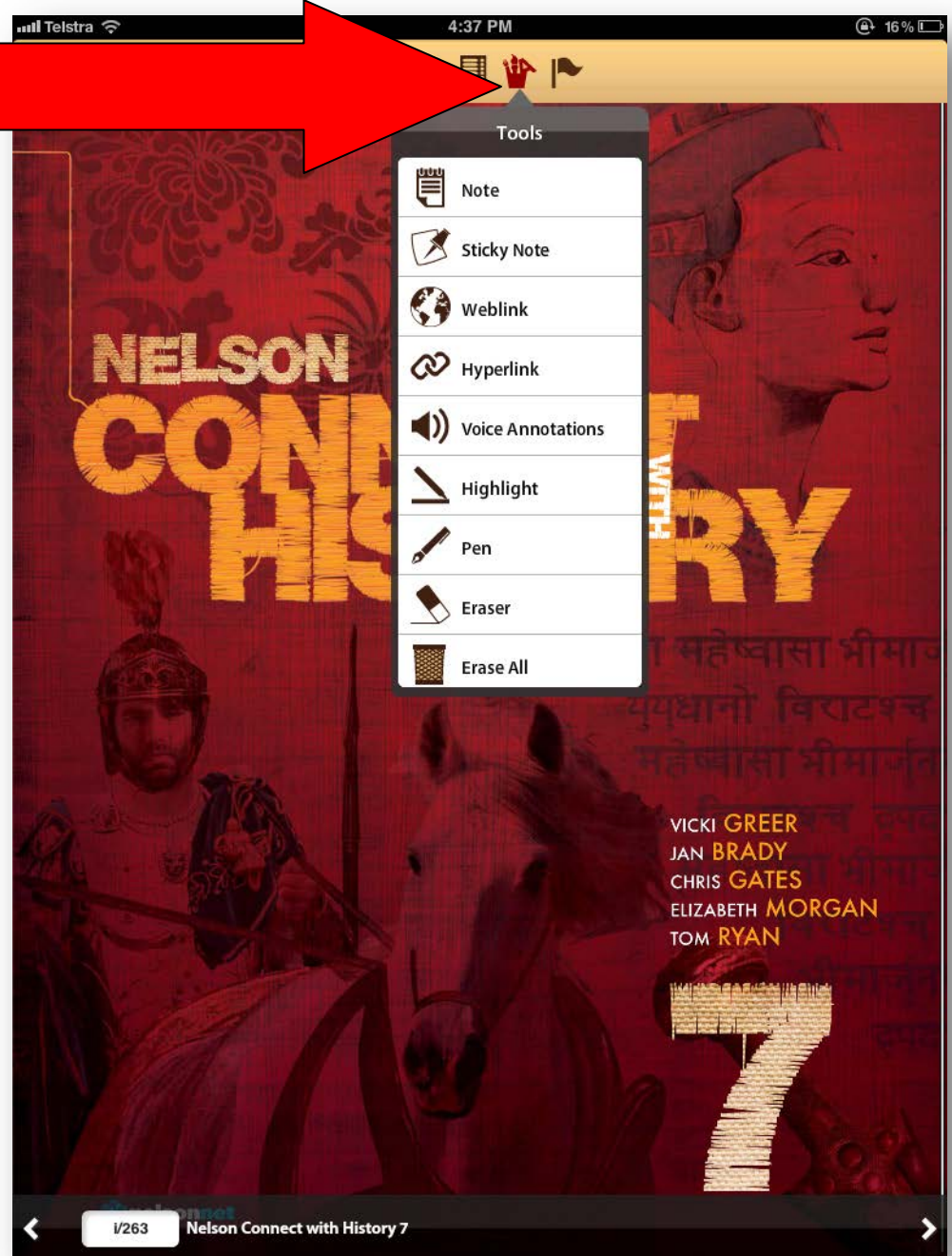


## Accessing the Tools Menu

To select the **Tools** menu simply select the **“Tools”** icon on the top.

In the **Tools** Menu you can.

- Add **Notes** to your eBook
- Add **Weblinks** to your eBook
- Add **HyperLinks** to your eBook
- Add **Voice Annotations** to your eBook
- Highlight Text and use the **Pen** Feature

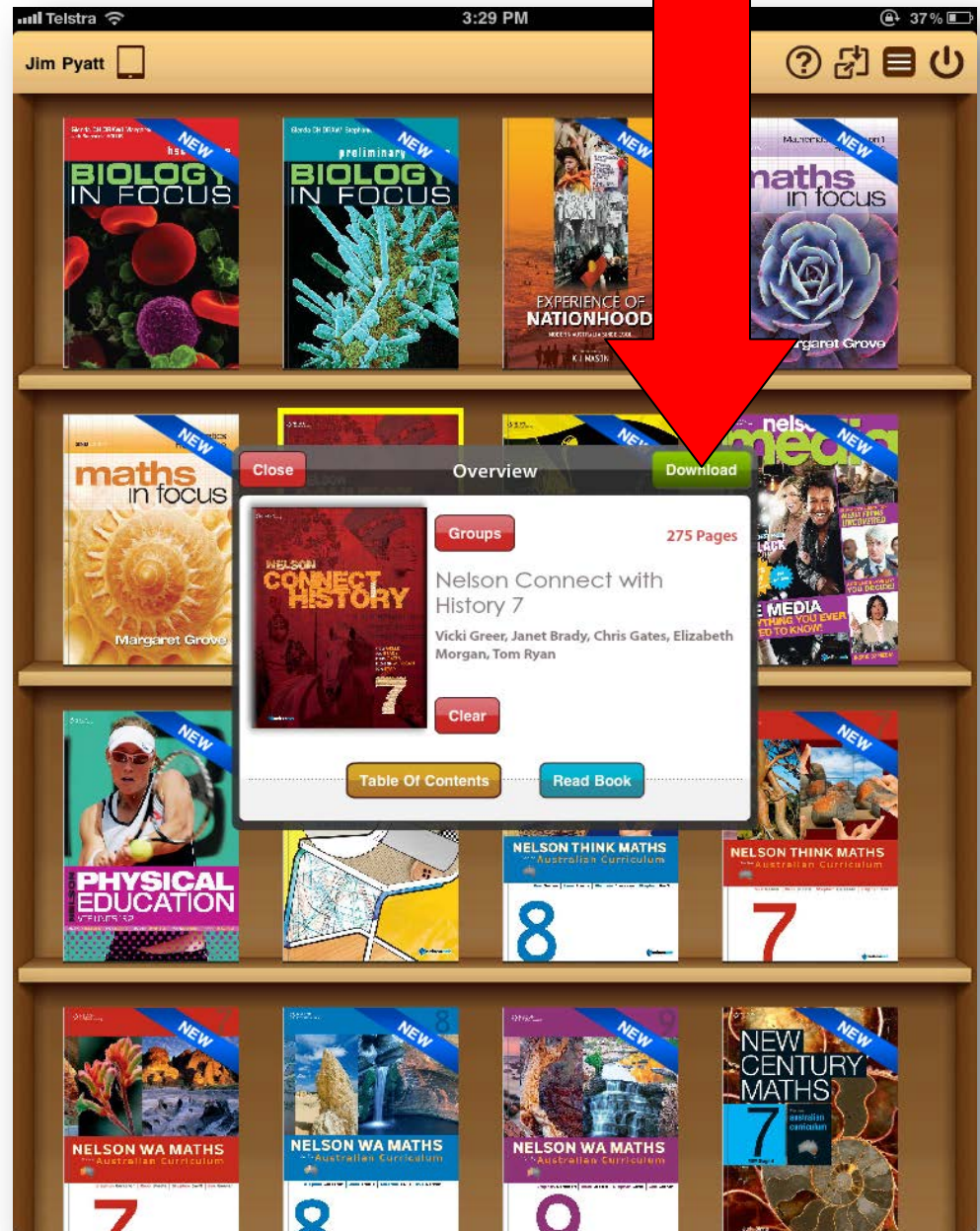


## Downloading an Offline Version of an eBook

Downloading an eBook allows you to read the eBook without the need to stream the content from the internet.

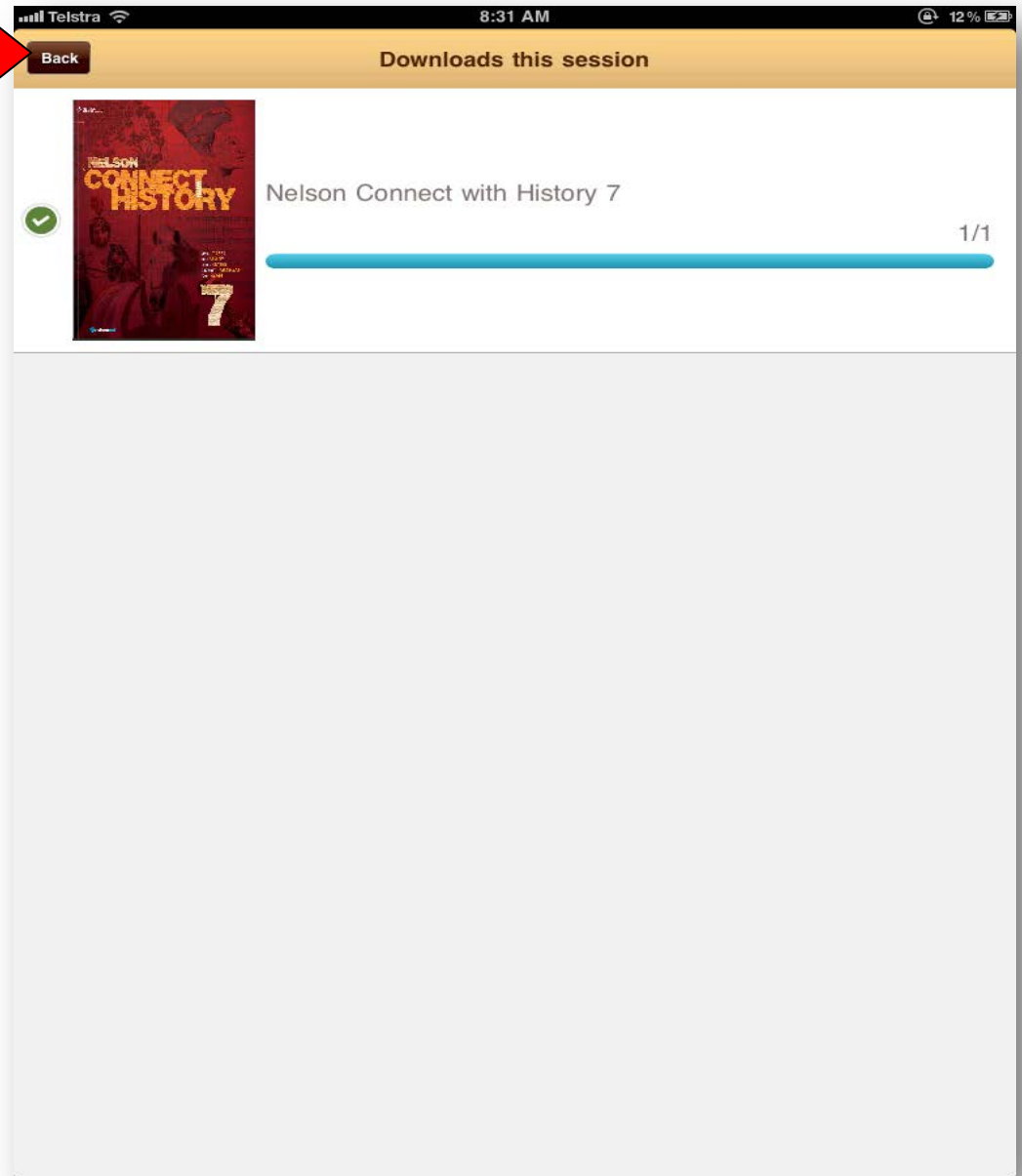
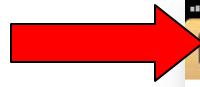
**Please Note:** While you can read a downloaded eBook offline you will need to be online in order to sign into the NelsonNetBook app. This is so that we can validate you as a NelsonNet customer.

To begin Downloading an eBook simply select the title from your Bookshelf and select **“Download”**



## Downloading an Offline Version of an eBook

After the eBook has completed downloading  
simply select **“Back”** to return to your  
bookshelf.





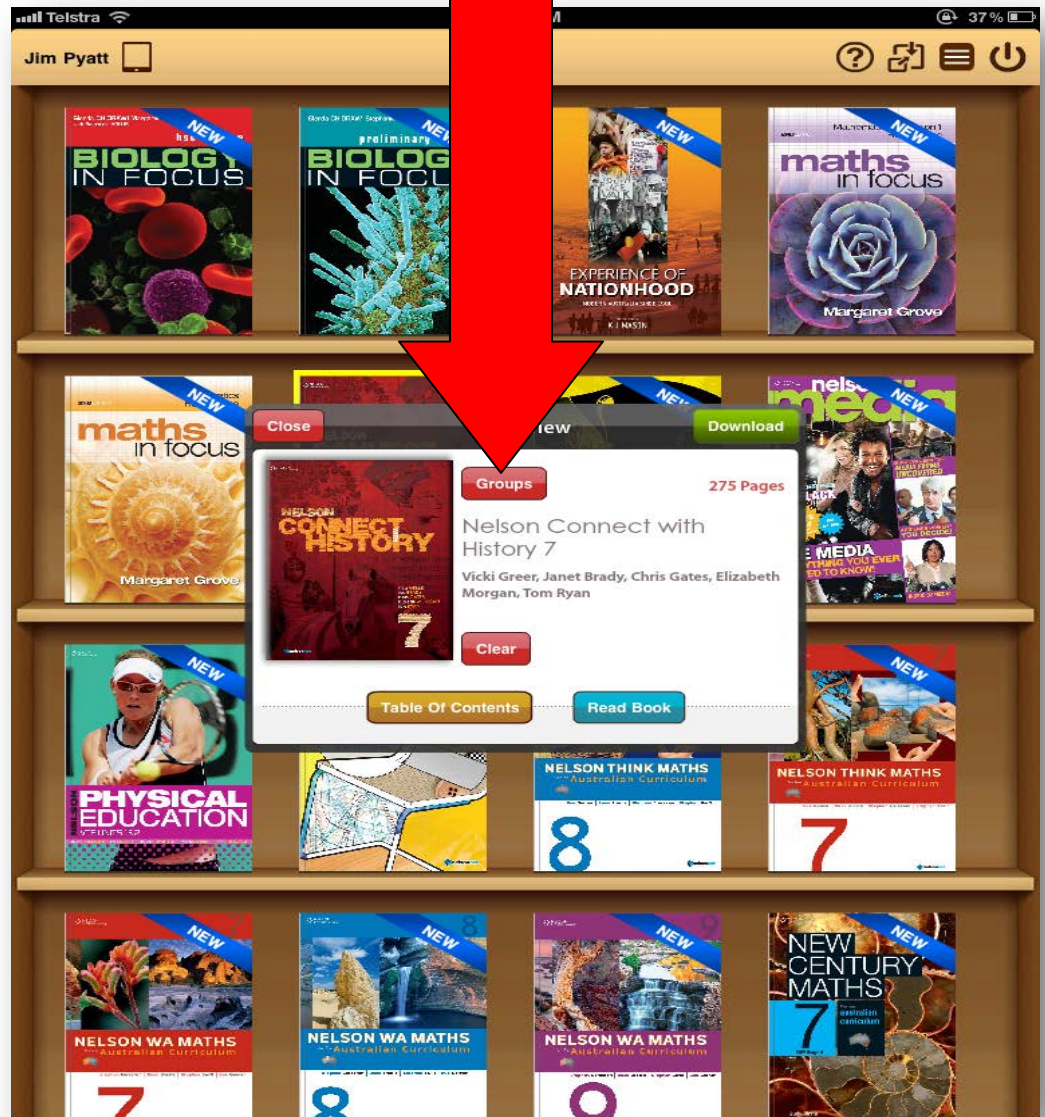


## Using “My Groups” on the NelsonNetBook

My Groups are a great way to share annotations with your students.

To access groups simply select the title from your bookshelf and press “Groups”

Please Note: You will need to have a NelsonNet Teacher account in order to create a group. Students will only be able to “Join” a group.

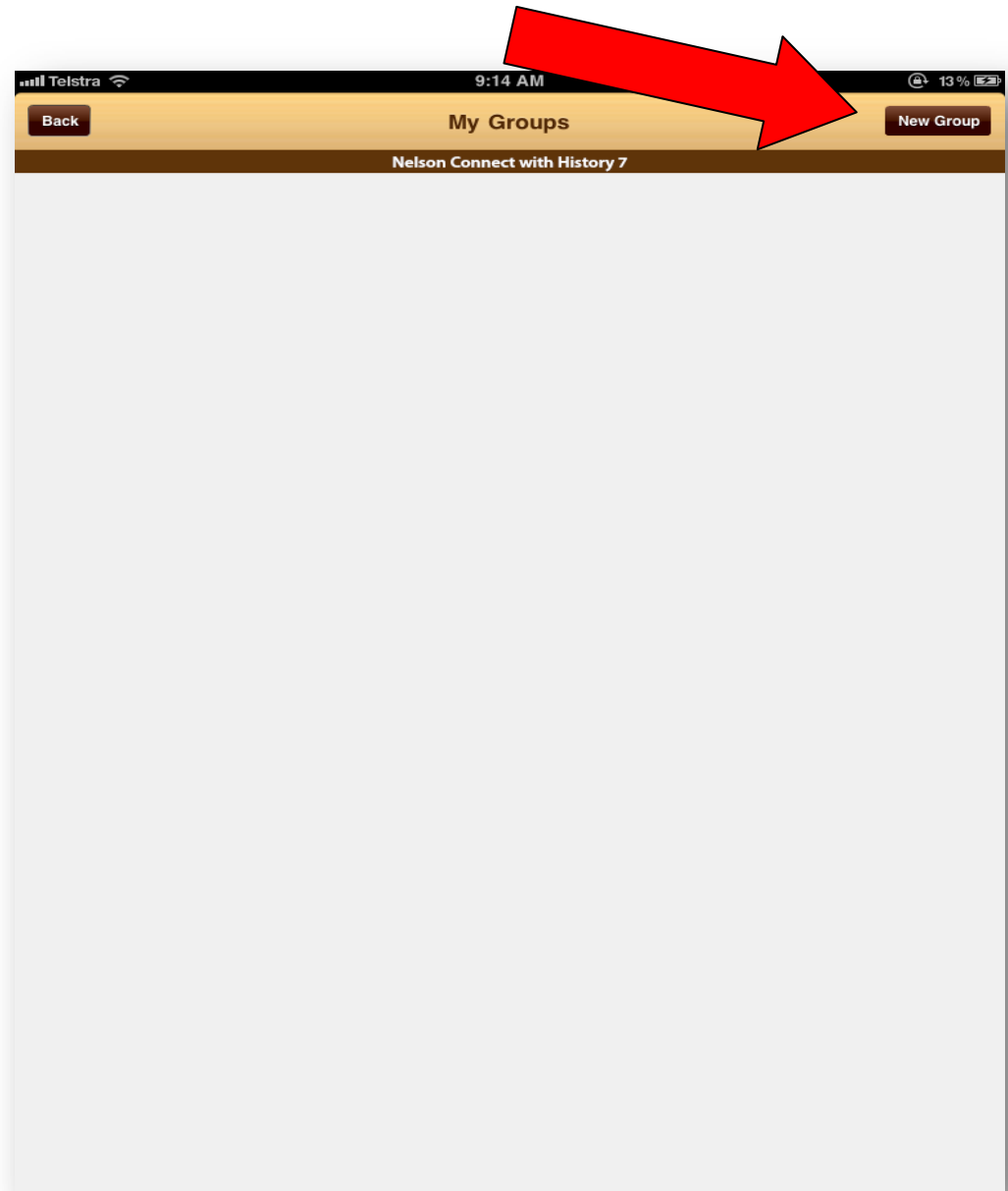


## Using “My Groups” on the NelsonNetBook

### Creating a new Group


To create a new group press “New Group”



## Creating a new Group

In the Group Details box enter a **group title**, **group code** and **group description**.

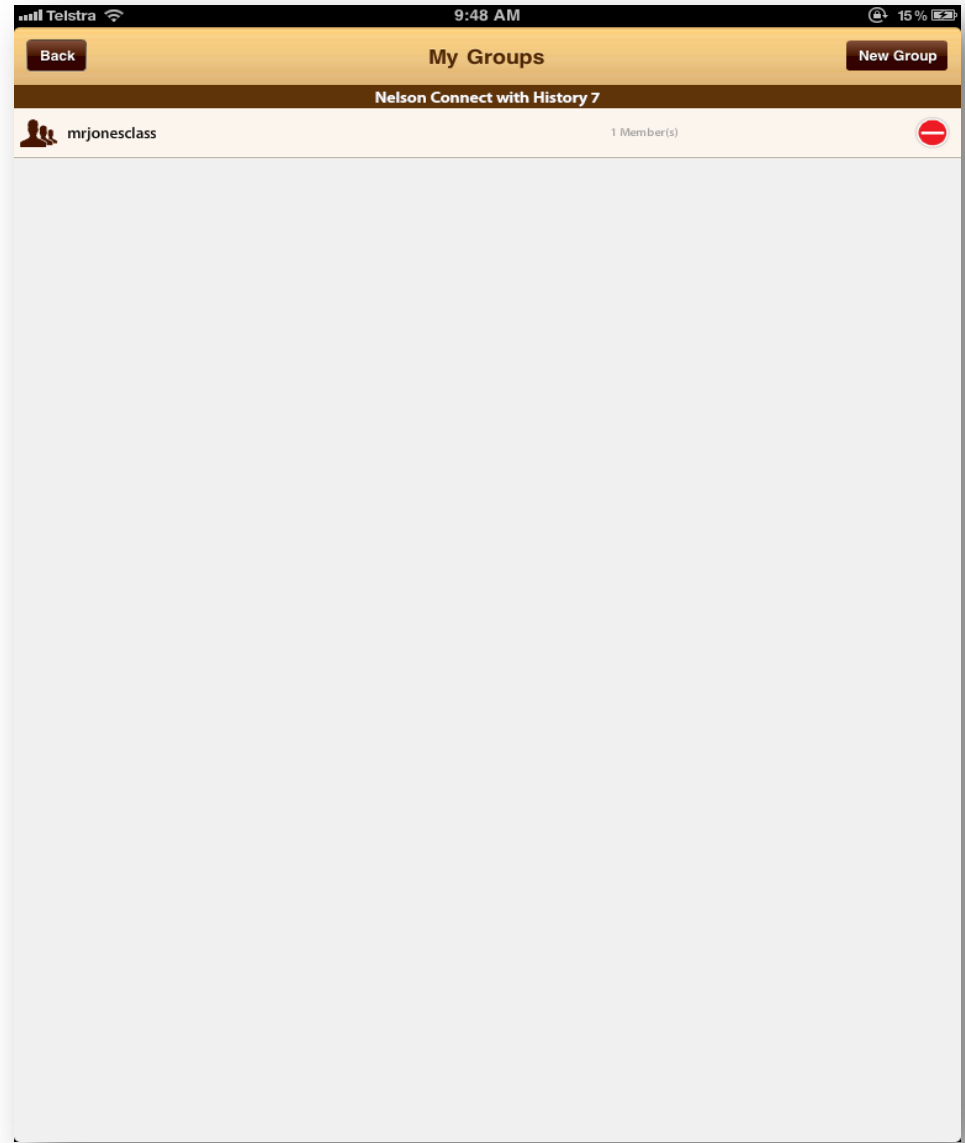
After entering these details click **“Save”**

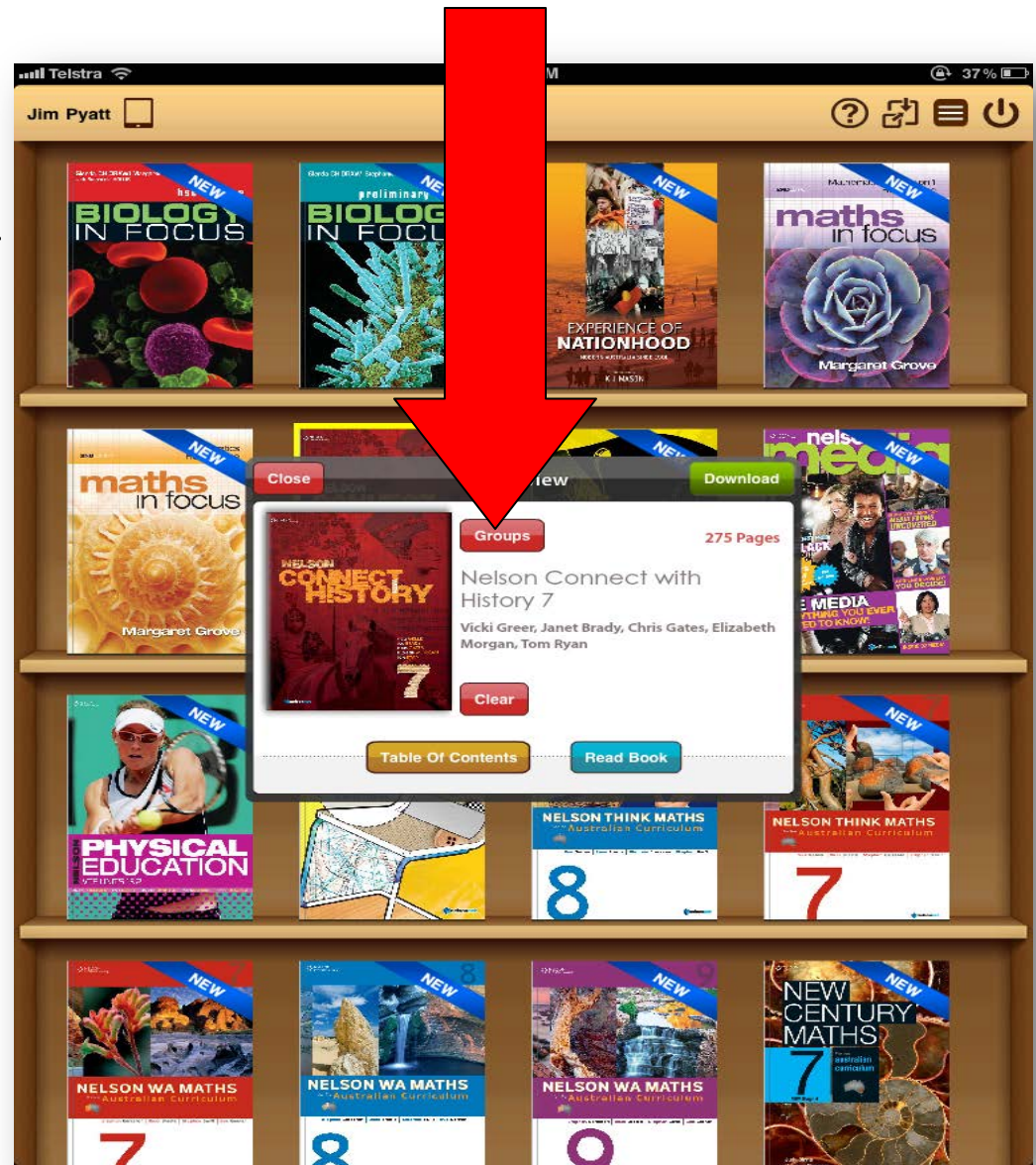
## Creating a new Group

“My Groups”



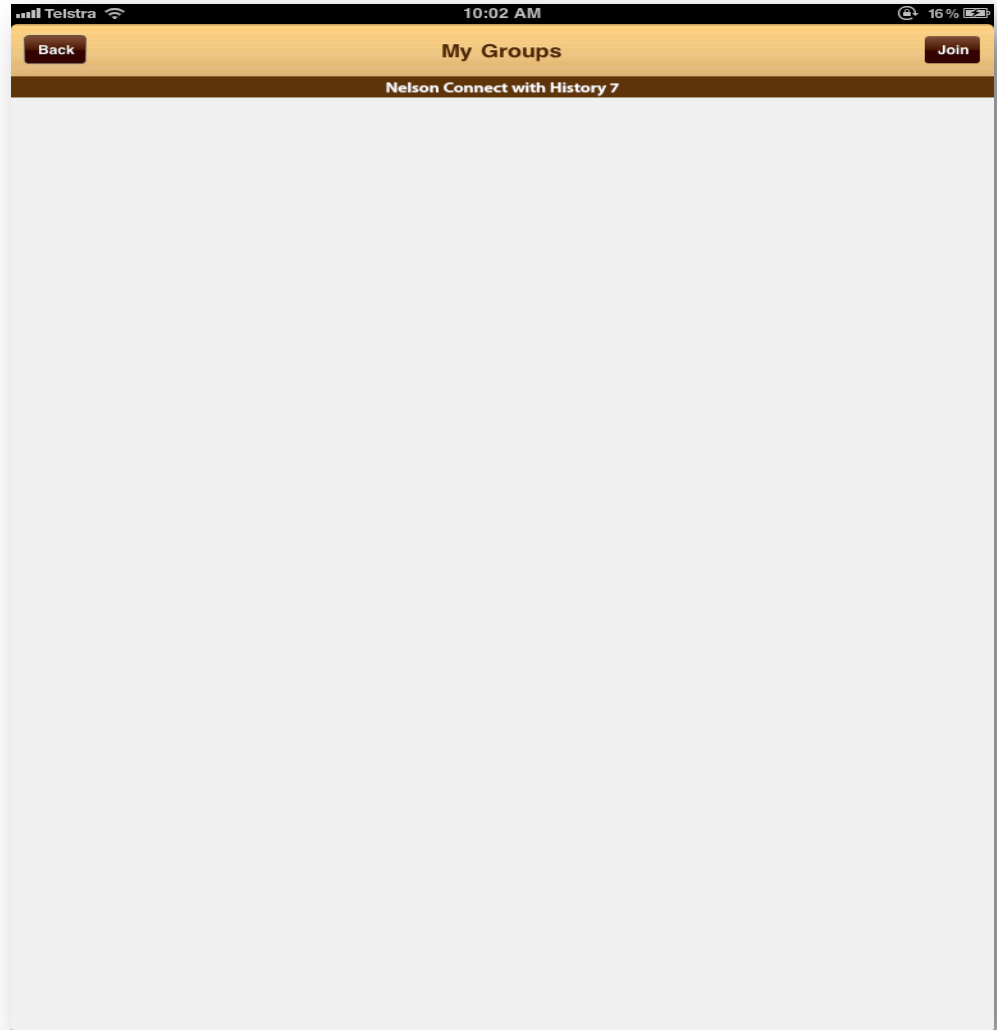
## How Students Join your Group

Students access groups the same way a teacher would by selecting the title from their Bookshelf and selecting “Groups”.



## How Students Join your Group

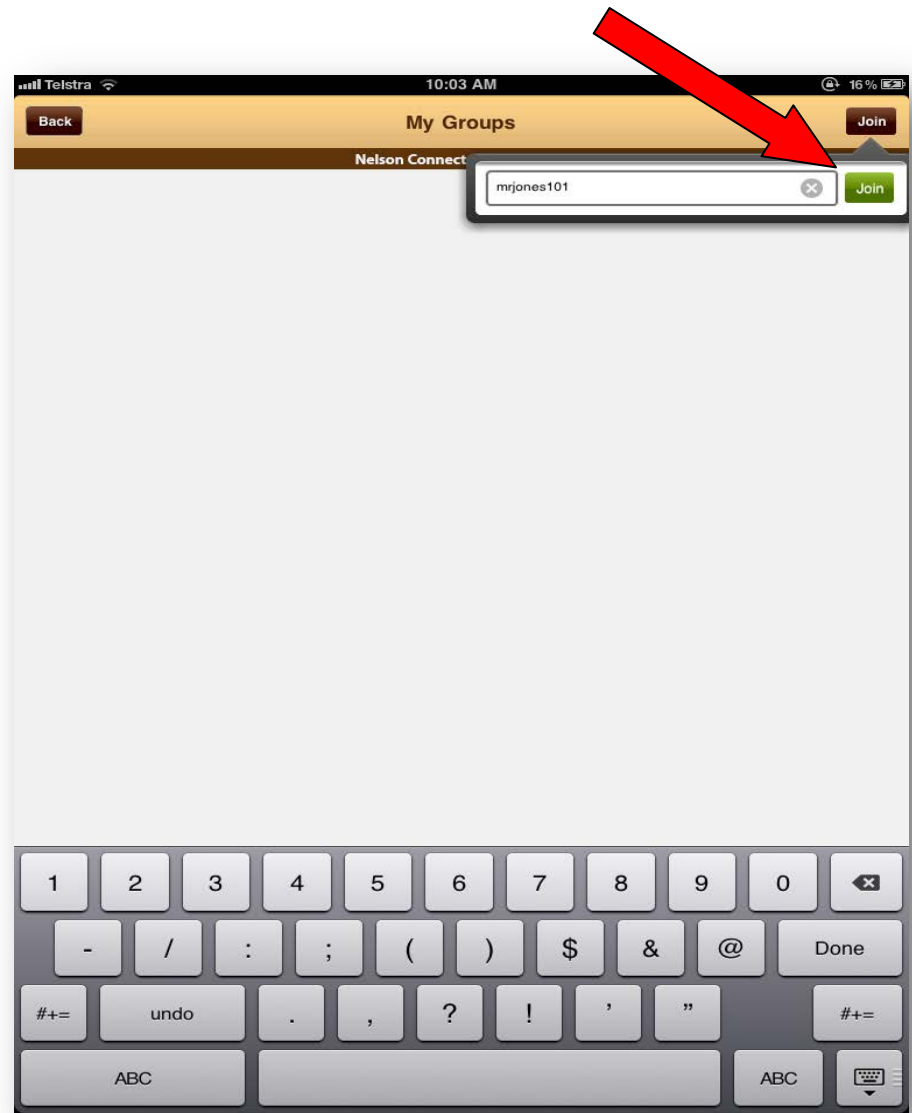
On the “My Groups” screen the Student simply needs to select “Join”



## How Students Join your Group

After selecting “**join**” the student needs to enter the group code that you created and press “**Join**”

This will assign the student to that group.





## Sharing annotations with your Group

By default the annotations that you make on your eBook such as Notes, voice annotations and weblinks will be shared with all of your groups.

To change which groups you would like to share annotations with, select the **“Settings”** icon from the eBook.

If you would not like to share annotations with a particular group simply switch the tabs to the **“off”** position and save.
