Funk and disco artists

Kool & The Gang

Formed in 1969, Kool & The Gang began with a very funky sound but gradually moved towards disco. The band was a major influence on Michael Jackson and Prince. Their hits include 'Celebrate' and 'Funky Stuff'.

Sly & The Family Stone

Formed in the late 1960s in California, Sly & The Family Stone was an integrated band with an eclectic sound which encompassed soul, funk, doo-wop and psychedelia. Their hits include 'Dance to the Music', 'Everyday People', 'Thank You' and 'Sex Machine'. Sly's band pioneered funk slap bass.

Funkadelic

The ultimate funk band, along with sister band Parliament, with outrageous costumes and stage shows, Funkadelic was led by George Clinton (Dr Funkenstein). They formed in 1964 as a soul band but quickly added a harder-edged guitar sound in imitation of Hendrix. Their hits include 'One Nation Under A Groove', 'Flash Light', 'Give Up The Funk (Tear the Roof off the Sucker)', 'Aqua-Boogie' and 'Atomic Dog'.

Donna Summer

Born Ladonna Gains, Donna Summer had a huge hit with 'Love To Love You, Baby' in 1975 and 'I Feel Love' and 'Down Deep Inside' in 1977. Her career was short and sharp.
